### Did vou know?

The Library is excited to announce that in early 2021, a new branch Library will open in southeast Wichita. The branch library will offer various services, including a large children's section, a teen space, a meeting room with after-hours access for Library programming and community use, and 16 public computers, with access to high-speed wireless internet.

Located at 4195 E. Harry, the Library is 6,900 square feet and allows for expanding public computing, a larger meeting room with after-hours capabilities, and zoned spaces to accommodate customer use needs better. We are thrilled that this move will bring library services back to District III!

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
